- ◆ Teach your kids to never give out personal information over the Internet to include—their name, address, phone number, passwords, parent's names, name of their school or job.
- ◆ Place your computer in an open area of your home where you can easily supervise your child's Internet activity.
- ◆ Establish house rules for Internet use at home and outside of the home. Remind your child that Internet use is a privilege, not a right.
- ◆ Monitor the amount of time your child spends on the Internet. Excessive time online, especially at night, may be your warning sign of impending danger.
- ◆ Spend time online with your child and establish an atmosphere of trust and open communication.
- ◆ Limit your child's Instant Messaging (IM) to a parental approved buddy list. Perform regular checks on your child's buddy list.
- ◆ Do not allow your child to participate in online chat rooms without your direct supervision. *Warning Sign-* online predators use chat rooms as their playground.

**Rules of the Road:
Safety on the Information Highway**

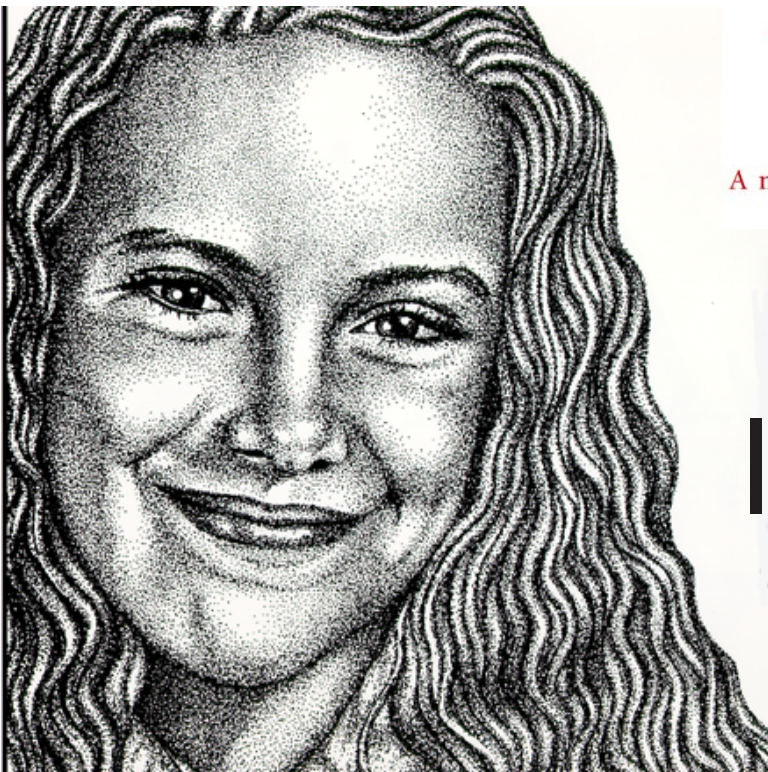
- ◆ If your child has a MYSPACE or other social networking account, do not allow personal profile information. Parents should check the account periodically.
 - ◆ Kid's should never plan to meet face-to-face with anyone they meet online.
 - ◆ **REMEMBER**—No software program can replace good parental skills.
- Do It Yourself DNA Collection Kit**
- ◆ Rub a clean (sterile if possible) cotton tip/swab* on the inside of cheek until moist.
 - ◆ Let air dry for twenty-four hours.
 - ◆ When dry, place in Zip-lock bag and seal bag.
 - ◆ Fold and place Zip-lock bag in another Zip lock bag and seal bag.
 - ◆ Label with child's name and sample date.
 - ◆ Place in a 2nd zip-lock bag and save in freezer until needed.
 - ◆ Follow same procedure for blood sample. However, wait until child scrapes or cuts him/herself before taking sample.
 - ◆ You may also save baby teeth in same manner.
 - ◆ *You can also use sterile gauze or a clean piece of filter paper.

Safety Tips for Children

- √ I will always check with my parents first.
- √ I will always play or go places with at least one other person – Not alone.
- √ I will trust my feelings. If something feels wrong, it is wrong.
- √ I will put physical distance between myself and whatever is making me feel uneasy.
- √ I know that certain people that I don't know can help me out of dangerous situations: mom's with kids; kids; police officers in uniform; or clerks in a store.
- √ I know that my body belongs to me.
- √ I will walk and play in places my parents approve of. I will avoid areas like alleys or dark stairwells.
- √ I will not talk to, accept gifts, or rides from adults I do not know without my parent's permission.
- √ I will always lock my home and car doors. I will not admit that I am home alone.
- √ I will learn to dial 911. I will learn my address and phone number. I will learn to use the pay phone without money.

What to do if your child is missing...

- √ **Immediately call (911) and all other local law enforcement agencies.** When law enforcement responds, present the officer with this Child Identification Packet. Insist that they enter the information into the National Crime Information Computer (NCIC) at once.
- √ If you suspect stranger abduction, **notify the Federal Bureau of Investigation.** FBI resources are unsurpassed in law enforcement.
- √ **Notify all local media assignment desks.** Work with the media - keep in mind that the general public's awareness about your missing child could be expedited by the broadcasting of details.
- √ **Notify your local nonprofit child locator agency.** They can log your child's image and pertinent information on the Internet, thereby guaranteeing instantaneous worldwide distribution. Call the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children.
- √ **Keep your home phone staffed and record conversations.** This may be the only way your child knows how to reach you.
- √ **Find a printer.** Volunteers will help you to post flyers in highly visible areas.
- √ Your best chance of recovery is to **encourage a massive coordinated response effort** by law enforcement, media, your child find agency, and volunteers.
- √ **Take care to preserve your physical well being.** Seek emotional and psychological support from your church or social service agencies. Remember, you alone are leading the battle for the return of your missing child.
- √ **Remember - Never Give Up Hope!**

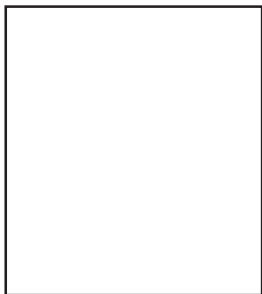
Safety Tips for Parents

- √ Keep this document in a safe place that is accessible 24/7 and update the photograph annually.
- √ Maintain current addresses and phone numbers of your children's friends.
- √ Know your neighbors. Every state allows the public to check the criminal backgrounds of those who have access to your children. Just contact local law enforcement.
- √ Know your neighborhood. Show your children the safest places to play and areas to avoid; like alleys and dark stairwells.
- √ Do not advertise your child's name on clothing, school supplies or backpacks.
- √ Get a cell phone or pager for your child. This way you can be in contact with them at all times.
- √ If you have an Internet ready computer in the home, put it in a common area and consider blocking software like *Net Nanny*. This way you can monitor your children's Internet activities.
- √ Seek alternatives to leaving your children alone at home, in the car or outside.
- √ Teach your children how to use a pay phone without money and how to call 911.
- √ If you maintain firearms in your home, use approved trigger locks and keep them safely locked up.
- √ Be a role model to your children. Listen and talk to your children, encourage them not to keep secrets, and settle arguments with words, not violence.
- √ By promoting your child's self-esteem and letting them know that you love them for who they are, you will teach them the self confidence they need to avoid drugs and crime.

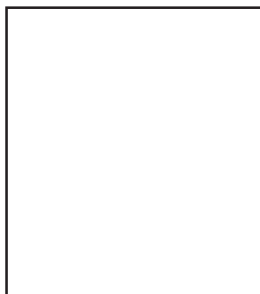
Community Action

- √ Work with local law enforcement to organize a neighborhood watch program. Establish good neighbor houses on every block.
- √ When time allows, volunteer at your children's school or in after school activities.
- √ Knowing your neighbors and neighborhood is one of the most important things you can do to ensure your family's safety.
- √ Report any crimes or suspicious activities to the police, school authorities and parents.
- √ Insist that your legislators, at all levels, support laws that are protective of and designed to benefit children.

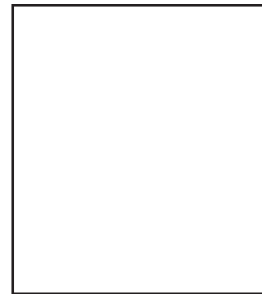

Directions for fingerprinting below:

- Make sure hands are clean
- Make sure fingers have even amount of ink
- Make sure fingerprints are clear and readable

You want to get prints just below the first knuckle & from nail to nail:

- Roll thumbs towards the body
- Roll fingers away from the body
- Roll fingers from edge of nail to the other (nail to nail)
- Make sure print is aligned and centered in the box.

*Press fingers onto ink surface and then onto fingerprint card - press flat on card and lift.
Press thumb onto ink surface then press flat on card and lift. Please note: Do not roll - just press and lift.
